Vincent HoSang is a Chinese Jamaican, who was born in Jamaica, and migrated to New York in the 1960's. He started his business career as a fried chicken restaurateur in the Bronx, which later evolved into a multi-million dollar operation under the brands of Royal Caribbean Bakery and Caribbean Foods Delights. Today, the Jamaican patties of Caribbean Food Delights are sold in major supermarkets and wholesale clubs such as Costco, BJ's and Sam's Club.

Through his charitable organization, the Vincent HoSang Family Foundation, Mr. HoSang has provided over 6,000 meals annually to Caribbean athletes. He also spearheaded the Jamaica Diaspora LINAC Machines Project to acquire two linear accelerator machines for cancer treatment at the Kingston Public Hospital and the Cornwall Regional Hospital in Jamaica. In addition, he has donated a thermal sensing machine for the Jamaica Ebola prevention program, and provided scholarship funds for the Lehman College Foundation and the University of the West Indies. For his philanthropic work, Mr. HoSang has received an honorary Doctorate of Laws degree conferred by the University of the West Indies in Jamaica. He was also awarded the Order of Jamaica, the fourth highest national honor presented by the Jamaican government.
